Historically, the building attests to the economic strength of Hagerstown in the years just prior to the Great Depression.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Alexander Inn stands at 6-8 Public Square in Hagerstown, Washington County, and is located on the southeast corner, fronting on both Public Square and East Washington Street.

Originally known as the Alexander Hotel, the Alexander Inn is a ten story 1927-1929 masonry and metal hotel structure with an eclectic Renaissance Revival influenced exterior arranged in a tripartite system corresponding to the base, shaft, and capital of a classical column. The lower two stories are constructed of masonry block imitating rustication. Levels three through eight are brick and terminate with a masonry cornice. The top two stories are also brick but serve as a crown or capital of the column. A low two story wing projects to the east. The building has six bays along Public Square and twelve bays along Washington Street.

Most of the windows of the building are of the classical double-hung, wooden type with six-over-six lights. The second and top story windows have round arches with masonry arch surrounds. The third story windows and wall have masonry quoining. The north side along East Washington Street has five two story large round arch windows on the lower stories. The windows on the ninth and tenth levels are decoratively connected vertically to give the impression of tall windows.

The building is structurally sound. The exterior is fairly original.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Erected for a group of Hagerstown businessmen, this eclectic Renaissance Revival influenced ten story hotel structure was built between 1927 and 1929. Work was begun on the building soon after ground was broken on 26 September 1927. The hotel opened for business on Saint Valentine's Day 1929. Historically, the building attests to the economic strength of Hagerstown in the years just prior to the Great Depression.

Architecturally, the Alexander Inn, originally called the Alexander Hotel, is a skyscraper with its exterior parts arranged in a tripartite system corresponding to a classical column, base, shaft, and capital. This is a type of building which was not possible until the development of the elevator, an invention which was well in use by the 1920s. The first skyscraper form buildings in Hagerstown were erected about the early 1900s. Another interesting architectural feature of the Alexander Inn is the contrast between it, a masonry and metal constructed building, and the neighboring brick and frame structures.

The Alexander Inn closed as a hotel in 1971 and has been empty since then.


