
Property Name/Address: Pangborn Park, Pangborn Blvd., Hagerstown, Maryland

Description/Significance: A 7½-acre public park comprising a formal garden, pond with stone pavilion or "sheltering house," recreational field, and picnic facilities, dedicated June 10, 1939. Land was donated by industrialists Thomas W. and John C. Pangborn; construction work was sponsored by the city with the cooperation of the Works Progress Administration. Exemplifies the development of park facilities during the WPA era.
