Description

This is a two story brick Gothic Revival church. The gable roof is covered with asbestos roofing. It is a three bay structure with pointed stained glass windows. It has brick corbeled pilasters and a polyagonal bell tower. The parish hall, 1932, is a brick structure with a gable roof and gabled wall dormers. There is an adjacent cemetery which was donated in the 1790s by John Donovan. The west portion is public and the remainder used by the Presbyterian, Episcopal and Catholic churches.
