Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*

This 2-story, 4-bay painted brick dwelling with stone foundation has paired end chimneys. The main entrance is located on the north gable end facing the road. Another doorway is located on the north gable side where a window was originally. According to the tax records the house was built in 1880. The house appears on the 1877 Atlas of Washington County as owned by V. Brognior.

There is a one-story addition with a balustrade along the roof on west side of house and a two-story addition on the east side. Both additions have vinyl siding. A stone retaining wall is located along the US 40 in front of the property. There is a frame barn and 1 story, single pen outbuilding in the rear of the property. (See attached Maryland Historic Trust (MHT) Inventory Form).

Although altered, the house retains sufficient setting and enough integrity to illustrate a mid-late 19th vernacular house that was typically built along the National Road during the 1850-1910 Period. The Fiery house is associated with the National Road and the Crossroad community of Pikesville, renamed Huyett c. 1900. The property meets Criteria A and is recommended eligible for the National Register of Historic Places.







DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is located along the south side of U.S. Route 40, just east of Huyett's Crossroads in Washington County, Maryland. It is situated on a low bank above the edge of the road with its north gable end facing toward the highway.

The structure is a two-story, four-bay brick dwelling, painted white with black trim. Modern frame additions are attached on the east and west walls. A modern enclosed entrance area of brick has been added to the north gable wall.


Low foundations of stone and block support the walls which show common bond brick work. Relatively recent brick masonry on the east wall suggests that a double porch may have been enclosed to enlarge the interior of the house.

Windows contain six-over-six light double-hung sashes held within narrow frames. Some lower story windows are flanked with paneled shutters while louvered shutters are present at upper story openings.

The roof is covered with sheet metal and terminates with a plain broad barge set against the end walls. Large double chimneys with corbels at their tops rise from inside the north end of the house. A single brick flue is located inside the south gable end.

The house is in good condition and stands on a tract containing 3 acres.



