DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is located a short distance south of Trovinger Mill Road, about one mile northwest of Chewsville in Washington County, Md. it is situated on level ground just north of a small stream and faces south.

The structure is a two-story, three-bay log dwelling covered with shingle siding. A one-and-a-half story stone structure is attached to the west gable end. A projecting, two-story rounded extension has been added to the north wall of the main section. The stone and brick structures have been covered with white stucco or "rough cast."

Most of the wall construction has been concealed by the shingles and rough cast. It appears, however, that the house is set on low fieldstone foundations. A partially exposed section of brickwork on the rounded addition displays common bonding.

Windows appear to have been spaced at random in all elevations. Those in the log section contain two-over-two pane Victorian period sashes ehdl within frames with late 19th century trim. Wide wooden frames appear in the stone section. On the brick portion, paneled shutters are present at the lower story while louvered shutters flank the second story windows.

Entrances are located in the center bay of the front elevation of the log section at the first and second story levels. They are simple in appearance with framing matching that of the windows. The door at the upper level has six raised panels. Another entrance is located in the south elevation of the stone section and in the north face of the brick section.

The roofs of the stone and log sections are of corrugated sheet metal. They terminate with plain barge boards set directly against the end walls. A gable roof dormer extends from the north slope of the brick section. Both the log and stone sections have deep overhanging porches framed under the main roof span. Simple cornice molding finishes the eaves.

Just west of the house is a square stone smokehouse with an attached spring house. A large barn is located nearby.

The house is in fair to good condition and stands on a tract containing 69.50 acres.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE			
<p>The area of significance of this house is its architecture. Showing log, stone and brick construction, it represents three periods of building.</p> <p>Many log structures were built in Washington County from the earliest days of settlement to well into the 19th century. A number of these buildings continue in use today disguised by various forms of siding or bricks. These are worthy of note as representatives of a major architectural group in Western Maryland and the Cumberland Valley. It would appear that the stone and log sections with their raised panel doors might date from the late 18th or very early 19th centuries. The rounded brick addition probably dates from after 1860. The overhanging porches included under the main roof span are another significant feature of the area.</p> <p>An 1859 map of Washington County shows the property to be in the possession of Joel Doub. Trovinger Mill Road is not shown on the map.</p>




