DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>This house is located a short distance southwest of Trovinger Mill Road about 3/4 mile west of Maryland Route 62 in Washington County. It is situated on an area of level ground and faces southwest toward a small stream.</p> <p>The structure is a two-story, three-bay brick dwelling, painted red with white trim. A one-story brick lean-to addition is attached to the front elevation, enclosing a section of the porch.</p> <p>The walls are set on low foundations and appear to employ all stretcher bonding. The windows have narrow framing and hold six-over-six pane double-hung sashes.</p> <p>The roof is covered with sheet metal and extends beyond the end walls of the house. A modern flue is located inside the northwest gable end. A one-story porch extends along the southwest and southeast elevations.</p> <p>The house is in good condition and stands on a tract containing 92.60 acres.</p> <p>A short distance southwest of the house is a small springhouse of rubble fieldstone. A barn and other farm buildings are located southeast of the house.</p>


STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The area of significance of this house is its architecture. It is an example of Washington County's 19th century vernacular building. Stotler listed as the owner.


