DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Antietam Paper Mills building, now the Hagerstown Paint and Glass Company warehouse, is located on the west bank of the Antietam Creek at the intersection of Antietam Drive and Paper Mill Road at Security in Washington County, Maryland.

The structure is a six bay industrial building with a low pitched gable roof. A shed roofed section, also of brick extends to the south. The walls display common bonding at both sections. The north or gable roofed portion of the structure has its wall surfaces broken by a series of brick pilasters which divide the bays. Brick corbeling at the tops of the pilasters breaks at regular intervals a course of heavy dentils, also of brick. All windows are elongated with segmentally arched heads formed by two rows of header bricks.

The building, said to have been erected in 1874 is in good condition. Although it has received some alterations, such as the enclosing of several windows in the south section and the installation of a large, garage type door, to accommodate modern use, its exterior appearance remains essentially intact. It is reported that much of the paper milling machinery remains in the building.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Antietam Paper Mill is significant for its architecture as a little-altered example of a small industrial structure of the late nineteenth century. It reflects the tremendous growth in manufacturing which took place in the post-civil war years, and as well, depicts in a simplified manner, architectural trends of the period.

The paper mill is also important for its contribution to commerce and industry in Washington County, and for the role it played as a unifying force in the tiny community which it created and of which it was the center. This is illustrated in the attached history of the paper mill as written by Clarence Itneyer in "Boyhood Memories of My Home Community," 1969.




