| DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE | |
| <p>This farm complex is located on the south side of Miller's Church Road, east of Jacob's Church and west of Strite Road, near the Mason-Dixon Line in Washington County, Maryland. It is situated on rather steeply sloping land and faces west.</p> <p>The dwelling is a two story, four bay structure set on coursed fieldstone foundations which are quite high at the south elevation. A four bay, two story ell extends to the rear of the main section. The front or original portion of the house is constructed of logs and sheathed with weatherboarding. A double porch included under the main roof span extends along the front elevation. The ell attached to the east elevation is of frame construction sheathed with weatherboarding matching that used at the front section.</p> <p>Openings are spaced at regular intervals in the front elevation while other elevations of the log structure show random window placement. Openings in the ell are aligned with each other at the north and south elevations. First story windows in the log section have wide wooden frames with simple molded trim which hold nine over six pane double hung sashes. At the second story level, similar frames hold six over six pane sashes. Windows in the ell have similar sashes held within frames with flat applied trim. Smaller windows set in the foundations have wide frames. One such window has a pair of board shutters.</p> <p>The main entrance is located in the second bay from the north end of the front elevation. The door is framed similarly to the windows and includes a narrow four light transom. Another entrance is located immediately above this at the second story level. It does not include a transom. Other entrances are located in the north and south elevation of the addition.</p> <p>The roof is covered with corrugated sheet metal and extends beyond the end walls. A bell tower is located on the roof ridge of the main section. The eaves boxing is finished with a course of simple ogee molding. Brick chimneys are located inside each gable end, inside the end of the ell and from the interior of the log section near the base of the east slope of its roof. A modern concrete block flue extends up the south wall of the addition.</p> <p>The interior of the log portion of the house is divided by board partitions. Doors have six raised panels with ogee trim. North of an interior partition which divides the house from front to rear is a large fireplace and a narrow stair located against the north wall and chimney. There is evidence that this portion of the house may have been divided into two rooms at one time. The remainder of the house consists of two rooms, the front chamber being the larger with a fireplace.</p> <p>The house appears to be in good condition. Just to the south of the dwelling is a square brick smoke house with a hipped roof. A frame bank barn is located west of the house. The property contains 152.37 acres.</p> | |

| STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE | | | |
| <p>This house is primarily significant for its architecture. It is ^arelatively large log dwelling in Washington County and also appears to be older than many existing log structures in the area. The house appears to have received few alterations. Its interior and exterior woodwork suggest a building date during the very early 19th century.</p> <p>The farm includes parts of the land grants "Rich Barrens" and "Forest." Rich Barrens, containing 1,154 acres was patented on April 27, 1767 to Peter Sheiss. In 1770 he sold 713 acres to Dr. Henry Schnebley which was renamed the Forest. In 1787 Dr. Schnebley sold portions of the Forest to Albertus Hafner, (Deed Liber T, Folio 731) who had probably resided as a tenant on the property for some years previously.¹ John Simpson acquired this property in two transactions from Daniel Hughes in 1807 and from John Heefner in 1809. In 1814 the property was purchased by Samuel Garver who in turn sold it to Samuel Lyday in 1832. (IN1/716, NN/107). Later the farm was in the Horst family from 1846 to 1876 (74/488).</p> | | | |


