DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Miller's Mennonite Church is located on the east side of Miller's Church Road, about 1/2 mile south of the Leitersburg-State Line Road in Washington County, Maryland. It is situated on sloping ground and faces north.

The church building is a one-story brick structure six bays in length and three bays wide. Additions with lower roof levels are attached at each gable end of the main section.

Foundations of the central portion of the building are of coursed local fieldstones. The end sections rest on concrete block foundations. The brick walls display all stretcher bonding at all elevations. Decorative trim includes segmental arches of brick over all windows.

Windows appear to have been spaced evenly in the walls. Those which could be observed contain six-over-six light double-hung sashes held within narrow frames under low arches. Openings in the main section are flanked by louvered shutters.

The roof is of slate and extends beyond the end walls. The eaves are treated simply with plain boxing. Small brick chimneys with several courses of corbeling at their tops are located inside each gable end.

The church is in excellent condition with cornerstones showing rebuilding dates in 1926 and 1968. Adjacent to the church is a large cemetery plot.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The significance of Miller's Mennonite Church lies in its association with early religious activity in Washington County and secondarily in its architecture.

The original Miller's Church as described in Herbert C. Bell's History of Leitersburg District, was a stone structure measuring 40 by 30 feet which was built in 1835. This stone building was replaced by the present structure in 1926.

The origin of the congregation of Miller's Mennonite Church springs from the early days of settlement in Washington County. According to historians of the Mennonite Church, Samuel Bachtel, born in 1732 was serving as a minister in 1770. Bell's History reports that an early Mennonite church stands on the farm near the village of Security in Washington County, which was the home of the Bachtel family. The 18th century stone building, now in deteriorated condition is described fully in form WA-I-114. The church on the Bachtel farm was in use until 1835 when the stone Miller's Church building was erected. On March 25th of that year, Christian Shank, Jacob Miller and John Strite entered into a contract with Joseph Cookston for the construction of the stone church on Jacob Miller's Farm.¹
