DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This weatherboarded outbuilding is located south of an early 20th century house east of Marsh Pike, south of Reid in Washington County, Maryland. The building is set perpendicular to the road on relatively level ground.

The structure is a long one story barn sheathed with German siding. Much of the building is of frame construction. One three bay section, toward the west end of the structure is much more sturdy in appearance than the remainder of the building. Thickness of walls of this segment of the barn suggests that the weatherboarding covers stone or log construction. This portion of the barn is said to be all that remains of the Spriggs Paradise mansion and its related outbuilding which burned in 1931. No early photographs of this complex have been found.

The barn is roofed with slate. Its ridge is marked by a series of square cupolas with hip tops. Small brick chimneys are located at the ends of stone or log section.

The building is in fair condition and stands on a tract containing .97 acre, part of the large 18th century Spriggs Paradise plantation.

A race track one mile in length and 60 feet wide is said to have been located west of the Marsh Pike.


