The Long Meadow Church of the Brethren, a brick structure dating from the late 19th century, was formerly associated with the German Baptist Church of Beaver Creek, Funkstown and Long Meadows of Washington County, Maryland. A major portion of the property, containing slightly more than an acre was conveyed by Jonas Rowland to the German Baptist Congregation in 1855. According to T.J.C. Williams History of Washington County, Jonas Rowland erected a frame church building on the property at his own expense in 1853. The wooden building is said to have been 40 X 53 feet and was replaced by the present structure in 1881. According to tradition, Robert E. Lee stopped at the church during the retreat from Gettysburg in 1863.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Long Meadow Church of the Brethren is located on the north side of Long Meadow Road a short distance east of Marsh Pike, near Paramount in Washington County, Maryland. The church building is situated on a rise of ground facing southwest and is surrounded by large oak trees. The structure is a one story building, six bays in length with a modern entrance addition to its southwest end wall and an ell extension to the east.

According to date tablets in the structure, the church was initially built in 1853 and remodeled in 1950. The large modern ell addition is dated 1960.

The building rests on low limestone foundations. The bricks forming the walls of the original section are laid in American or common bond, with, generally six courses of stretcher bricks between rows of headers. The newer construction utilizes all stretcher brick work. Flat arches of brick are present above the window openings. There is no decorative work associated with the masonry.

Windows have narrow mitered frames finished with a bead at the inside edge. They hold nine over six pane double hung sashes.

The roof is covered with modern asphalt shingles and extends beyond the end walls. It is trimmed with simple cornice molding finishes the eaves.

Adjoining the church is a cemetery. The church property contains almost two acres.




