DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farm complex is located at 2721 Paradise Church Road, on the west side of the road north of Hagerstown in Washington County, Maryland. The house is situated on a slight rise of ground near two large springs on the west branch of Marsh Run. It faces east.

It is a two part structure consisting of a rectangular stone section set on an east-west axis. Extending from its south elevation is a two story, two bay brick addition. The walls of the stone structure have been covered with rough cast and colored red to match the brick addition. An inscription in the west gable indicates that the house was rebuilt in 1894. Where portions of the stone walls are visible, roughly coursed masonry can be seen.

The brick addition rests on low fieldstone foundations. Its walls display American or common bonding with six rows of stretchers between header courses. Segmental arches of upright bricks are present above the windows and doors.

In both sections of the house, either two over two or single pane, double hung sashes are present. At the first story level they are flanked by shutters with louvered upper sections and panels below. Regular louvered shutters are present at the second story level.

The roof of the house which projects beyond the end walls at both sections, is sheathed with modern asphalt shingles. Brick chimneys with several courses of corbeling are located inside each gable end.

A one story porch supported by chamfered wooden posts is located along the east elevation of the addition. At the west elevation is a one story modern addition.

A large frame bank barn is located west of the house. It is dated 1884.

The buildings appear to be in excellent condition and are part of a farm containing 100.64 acres.

From 1881 to 1933, the farm was owned by Adam, Henry and Isaac Baer respectively. It was purchased by Isaac W. Martin in 1933 and has remained in that family to the present.

→ property is part of "Sprigg's Paradise" a large plantation which included more than 70 acres. It was subdivided into smaller farms during the early 19th century.


