 DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is located on the east side of a private lane which extends in a northerly direction from U.S. Route 40 near its junction with Maryland Route 144 about three miles west of Hagerstown in Washington County, Maryland. The lane terminates at a group of farm buildings described in form WA-I-336.

The house is a two story, five bay log and frame structure which faces south. It is sheathed with imitation brick composition siding. The three western bays of the house would appear to be of log construction as suggested by the thickness of the walls at the window and door jambs. The two eastern bays appear to be a late 19th or early 20th century frame addition. They are recessed behind a double porch which is included under the main roof span.

Windows and doors appear to be aligned with each other in the walls. Windows at the front elevation of the main section have two over two pane late 19th century double hung sashes. At the rear elevation and in the frame section nine over six or six over six light sashes are used. Window casings are narrow. The main entrance is located in the west end bay of the front or south elevation. Framed above the door is a narrow transom. Along the front elevation of the west section is a one story porch supported by plain square posts.

The roof is sheathed with modern asphalt shingles and extends beyond the end walls. Small brick chimneys with corbels at their tops are located inside the end walls.

A small frame outbuilding or summer kitchen is located southeast of the house.

The buildings appear to be in fair to good condition and stand on a tract containing .87 acres.


