DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farm is located at the end of a private lane which extends in a northwesterly direction from Hopewell Road near its junction with Halfway Blvd., southwest of Hagerstown in Washington County, Maryland. The buildings are situated on rolling limestone land and face east.

The house is a two story, three bay stone structure with a one story, three bay wooden frame addition to its west end. The walls of the main house are built of coursed local limestone using relatively small uniformly shaped stones. Diagonal marks in the south gable show that there were two earlier additions prior to the present frame extension. A full size window in the gable has been closed with stone and brick. Small stones are centered over some windows, suggesting keystones.

Openings appear to be aligned with each other in the walls. Windows and doors have narrow casings finished with a bead at the inside edge. Nine over six pane double hung sashes are used at the first story while six over six sashes are present at the second floor level. Some first story windows retain pairs of three panel shutters. The main entrance is located in the south end bay of the front or east elevation. The four panel door is hung beneath a four light transom. A one story, three bay early 20th century porch supported by tapered square pillars extends across the front elevation.

The roof is sheathed with modern asphalt shingles and terminates with barge boards set directly against the end walls. A large inside end brick chimney is centered in the north elevation.

Just west of the house is a one story two bay, stone outbuilding with remains of a wood shingle roof. The door framing is massive with pegged joining.

West of the house is a large stone end bank barn. A flat stone which may be a date tablet was set in the peak of the gable at the south end wall.

The house appears to be in excellent condition while the barn and outbuildings are in deteriorated or fair condition. The property contains 165.25 acres.






