Description of Property and Justification: *(Please attach map and photo)*

This complex which includes a stone and frame house and the site of the Sprechers Mill or Salisbury Mill. The house is a one-and one-half, four bay stone dwelling with a one and a half story, one bay frame wing which was added in the 1970's. The building is constructed of roughly coursed local limestone. Decorative masonry is limited to small roughly shaped keystones above the window and door openings. Windows have narrow casings which hold six over six pane sashes. A stone chimney which has been rebuilt is located inside the east end wall.

Northeast of the house is the site of an early 19th century grist mill. No observable evidence of the mill remains although it is said to have been a frame structure. A cooper's shop is also said to have been present as well as a bake oven.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This complex which includes a stone and frame house and the site of Sprechers Mill or Salisbury Mill is located on the west side of Hopewell Road, south of Interstate 70 and west of Interstate 81 near Williamsport in Washington County, Maryland.

The house is situated on an area of relatively level ground and faces north. It is a one and a half story, four bay stone dwelling with a one and a half story, one bay frame wing which was added by the present owner. A double porch is included under the main roof span. A series of modern gable roofed dormer windows extends from the north and south slopes of the roof.

The building is constructed of roughly coursed local limestone. Decorative masonry is limited to small roughly shaped keystones above the window and door openings. Windows have narrow casings which hold six over six pane sashes. The main entrance is located in the west end bay of the front elevation. It is framed similarly to the windows and includes a narrow transom. This entrance is reached by a flight of stairs leading to the upper level of the porch. Another door is located at the ground story. This is a double door with four panels in each section.

A stone chimney which has been rebuilt is located inside the east end wall.

Northeast of the house is the site of an early 19th century grist mill. No observable evidence of the mill remains although it is said to have been a frame structure. A cooper's shop is also said to have been present as well as a bake oven. All that remains of the complex now is the stone house which is in excellent condition and stands on a tract containing 2.67 acres. South of Hopewell Road is a brick house which was at one time part of the Sprecher's Mill property. It apparently was the main dwelling for the mill and is discussed in form WA-I-357.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE




