Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: (Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)

According to the Maryland Historical Trust (MHT) Inventory Form (attached), the Garden of Eden Farm includes a house and barn on 71.13 acres which was originally part of the "Conococheague Manor" and "Garden of Eden" land grants. The 2-1/2 story, brick multi-gabled residence has a steeply pitched overhanging slate roof and asymmetrically plan not a typical style for a rural house in Washington County. Built in the mid 19th century (c.1855 according to the tax records), this large Queen Anne style displays some unusually fine woodwork. The barn is a good example of a frame bank barn. It has a stone foundation and unusual decorative trim and window heads over louvered ventilators.

The Garden of Eden Farm is associated with the Agricultural and Trade period (1850-1910) in Washington County and retains enough integrity to illustrate late ninetieth century Queen Anne architecture. The Garden of Eden Farm is significant for its architecture and association with the history of agriculture in Washington County. It meets both criteria A and C and is recommended eligible for the National Register of Historic Places.

It is recommended that the entire tax parcel (71.13 acres) be included it the National Register of Historic Places.





DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The farm known as "Garden of Eden" is located between Maryland route 63, and I-81 just south of Williamsport in Washington County. The buildings are situated on an area of level limestone ground and face east.

The house is a two story multi-gabled brick structure with a steeply pitched overhanging roof. It rests on fieldstone foundations. At the front or east elevation the house is three bays wide with the southern most bay set in a two story projecting gable. At the south elevation, the house is two bays wide at the front or east section with a three bay wing inset from the plane of the south wall, extending to the west. This wing is lower in height than the front section. The north elevation, a gable end wall of the front section is two bays wide. Brick at all elevations are laid in American bond with segmental arches above openings in the front section and flat arches above those in the wing.

Openings are aligned with each other in the walls. All windows in the front section have segmentally arched heads. Some at the second story have two over two pane double hung sashes. Others are double windows with single pane sashes divided by wide mullions. The window in the north end bay of the front elevation is elongated with double triple hung single pane sashes. Most windows are flanked with pairs of shutters with movable louvers. In the east, west and south slopes of the roof, aligned with the other windows are small dormers with steeply pitched overhanging gable rooves. At the east end of the south elevation is a one story sea hexagonal wooden projecting bay with a flat roof and bracketed cornice. In the wing at the rear are rectangular windows with four over four light sashes. A porch along its south elevation has partially been enclosed with German siding.

The main entrance is located in the central bay of the front elevation. Like the windows, it has a segmentally arched head and includes a single pane transom. The door is double, each half having a large round arched single glass pane and is flanked by louvered shutters. It is sheltered by a one story, two bay porch supported by square posts. Another entrance is located in the south elevation of the wing.

The roof of the house is sheathed with slates in an imbricated pattern having horizontal bands of scalloped slates which appear nearly centered on the roof slopes. The roof extends some distance beyond the end walls as well as overhanging at the eaves. Chimneys protrude from the ridge, and from the east and west slopes of the roof at the front section. These chimneys are of brick with projecting patterns and corbeling. Another chimney is located inside the west end wall of the wing.

The interior of the house is divided by a central stair hall featuring a curved stair open to the attic. Decorative carving appears at the ends of the risers. Generally, the rooms have high ceilings with massive woodwork. Fire places are located on interior walls of the rooms.

A frame bank barn rests on fieldstone foundations. In its walls are louvered ventilators with Victorian applied trim. Above the ventilators are scalloped applied pieces with cut clover leaves or shamrocks.

The buildings are in excellent condition with the farm containing 103.42 acres. It is made up of parts of the land grants "Conococheague Manor" and "Garden of Eden."

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

"Garden of Eden" Farm is significant for its architecture and for its association with the history of agriculture in Washington County. The existing fabric of the house would suggest a construction date during the last quarter of the 19th century. It is a large brick structure with many gables and a steeply pitched overhanging slate roof, and displays some unusually fine woodwork of the late 19th century period not frequently found among Washington County's country houses. According to family tradition, however, the house is supposed to incorporate parts from an earlier structure. Indeed, it is possible that the west wing of the house where an earlier style of woodwork can be seen may be older than the front section. The barn also has unusual trim.

According to Washington County Land Records the farm was part of the land willed by Otho Holland Williams who died in 1794 to Mary Emma Williams. Otho H. Williams owned a great quantity of land in the Williamsport vicinity including "Rose Hill Manor" (WA-I-374) which adjoins this farm to the south and "Springfield Farm" (WA-I-024) just north of Williamsport. In 1871 the property was owned by Alonzo Berry who sold it to Louisa Jane Berry in that year. (WMckk4/87). In 1880 it was purchased by Charles W. Humrichouse for \$5050.56, containing 121 1/4 acres. (80/155). Charles W. Humrichouse lived at Springfield Farm but owned this property apparently into the early 20th century. It was purchased by the present owners in 1942.




