DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is located on the south side of Sterling Road, just west of the Penn Central Railroad tracks, east of Williamsport in Washington County, Maryland. It faces north toward the road.

The building is a two story, three bay brick structure resting on low fieldstone foundations. Bricks are laid in common bond at all elevations and the entire structure is painted white. Flat arches of upright bricks are present above the openings.

Apparently, Sterling Road is relatively new and was constructed to link two parts of Doub Road which makes a bend to the south below this house. According to maps, this house was formerly approached by a private lane extending from the portion of Doub Road lying to the west of this house. The original front elevation of the house may have been its south facade. Part of the south wall was recessed under the main roof span and had a double porch. This has since been enclosed with siding. Many houses in Washington County have porches like this at their front elevations.

Windows and doors have narrow frames finished with a bead at the inside edge. They hold single pane, double hung sashes. Some retain pairs of shutters with movable louvers.

An entrance is located in the center bay of the north elevation. Another door is located in the inset porch in the south wall. An enclosed one story front porch extends along the entire front elevation.

The roof of the house is sheathed with standing seam sheet metal and extends beyond the end walls. Small brick chimneys are located inside the end walls.

The house appears to be in fair condition and stands on a tract containing 30.88 acres.


