DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house stands on the south edge of Long Meadow Road just west of Paramount, north of Hagerstown in Washington County, Maryland. It faces north. The house is a two story, five bay brick structure resting on low stone foundations. The three eastern bays would appear to be of a different construction from the remainder of the house. The entire structure has been painted white. Bricks are laid in American or common bond at all elevations. Segmental arches top the openings of the three eastern bays while flat arches are present above the openings in the west section. Most windows have two over two pane sashes.

Entrances are located in the second bays from each end of the front elevation. Each door has a transom and both are sheltered by a one story porch which extends along the three central bays of the front wall.

The roof is sheathed with slates and extends beyond the end walls. Corbeled brick chimneys are located inside the end walls and at the point where the two sections of the house join.

The house appears to be in good to excellent condition and stands on a lot containing .74 acre.
