Late 19th Century

The Showalter House is an unusually elaborate farmhouse for the Hagerstown area. Its decoration and size indicate the prosperity of the builder, a display not often found in the area, perhaps because of the conservative religious and cultural background. The house is a two story, irregular plan brick building with a polygonal bay and french doors opening on a balustraded terrace. This sophisticated arrangement contrasts with the traditional arched window openings with incised floral infill.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Showalter House is a two story late nineteenth century brick farmhouse located on the north side of Eden Road, immediately west of the Western Maryland railroad tracks in the northern vicinity of Hagerstown.

The house has an irregular plan and the elevations reflect this irregularity. The main facade, facing south is three bays wide, with an open terrace and low balustrade. The eastern bay on the first floor is a projecting polygonal bay. The center bay has french doors with a rectangular fixed transom. The fenestration is set in arched openings with incised floral decorative infill. Most windows have shutters and are 4/4 sliding sash. The center window on the second floor has a slightly lower sill than the others, although it does not appear to be an altered doorway.

A wood cornice or belt separates the first and second floors and at the west elevation, projects into a small porch sheltering the main entry which is in a projecting bay of the west side. The doorframe here is peaked and has incised fluted architraves.

The hipped roof is slate and is broken by a central chimney.

A one and a half story rear addition, probably later in date than the main section, is attached to the main block through the original ell which is one story high.

A twentieth century garage and a large frame bank barn probably contemporary, with the house, are located north of the house.


