
14201 Pennsylvania Avenue does not appear eligible for listing in the NRHP under Criteria A, B,C, or D. The resource does not appear significant for its method of construction or architecture. The foursquare type is a common building found throughout Maryland and 14201 Pennsylvania Avenue is a fairly typical example. Moreover, archival research conducted at local and county libraries and historical societies, and investigations of cultural resource studies at MHT have produced no information indicating the resource to be significant for its association with significant events or persons, or for its ability to yield information important in historic or prehistory.

14201 Pennsylvania Avenue is a brick, two-and-one-half story, five-bay, two-pile four square-type dwelling. The resource faces west and has a rusticated concrete block foundation. The resource has a hipped roof, covered with slate shingles. Hipped dormers, housing paired windows, are evident on the front and side elevations, and probably are found on the rear elevation, as well. An interior brick chimney is located on the south elevation. Window openings have stone sills and lintels and contain one-over-one wood sash. A 1981 survey form notes louvered shutters on the dwelling, but they have since been removed. An open porch extends full-width across the front façade and wraps around the south façade. The porch is supported on wooden Tuscan columns. A single-story brick section extends off the east (rear) façade and contains a brick chimney. There are three outbuildings located east of the dwelling. All are frame with gable roofs.

According to Washington County Tax Assessment records, 14201 Pennsylvania Avenue was built in 1916. The numerous outbuildings, as well as close proximity to Pennsylvania Avenue, serve as an indicator that this may once have been a commercial enterprise, such as a workshop or repair facility. Pennsylvania Avenue serves as a main road between Hagerstown and points north, and 14201 Pennsylvania Avenue may have been an early example of auto-related, non-agricultural development along Pennsylvania Avenue.

14201 Pennsylvania Avenue does not appear eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places under Criteria A, B, C, or D (as specified in 36 CFR 60.4). The resource does not appear significant for its method of construction or architecture (Criterion C). The four square-type is a common early twentieth century building type found throughout Maryland, and 14201 Pennsylvania Avenue is a fairly typical example. Moreover, archival research conducted at local and county libraries and historical societies, and investigations of cultural resource studies at MHT have produced no information indicating the resource to be significant for its associations with significant events or persons, or for its ability to yield information important in prehistory or history (Criteria A, B, and D).



The Strite House is a typical early twentieth century house, the form of which began to be adapted in all parts of Maryland during this period. The house is basically square with a hipped roof in contrast to the gable roof of earlier houses. The roof has a single dormer in each elevation. The five bay main elevation remains as in early houses, but a polygonal bay on the first floor is a typical feature of late nineteenth century. A one story shed roofed porch on Tuscan columns is also common to houses of this period.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Strite House is a two and one half story brick house with porch dating from the early twentieth century and located at the intersection of Middleburg Pike (U.S. 11) and Showalter Road north of Hagerstown, Maryland.

The house faces west and has a five bay main elevation with a central entrance. The southern two bays on the first floor are occupied by a polygonal bay window projection. A one-story shed roofed porch extends across the west and south elevations. The floor of the porch is wood planks and the roof is supported on Tuscan columns.

The fenestration is 1/1 sliding sash with stone sills and lintels. All the visible windows have louvered shutters. The slate roof is pyramidal and has dormers with paired windows in the center of each elevation. The sides of each dormer are covered in slate.

The house is located at the edge of Middleburg Pike with a small front yard surrounded by a deteriorating iron fence. There are several large trees on the site which effectively shield the house from the street.
