The Frame House is a one-story, one-bay by two-bay cottage on a concrete block foundation. It is covered in wood siding painted white. The main facade is asymmetrical marked by a central entrance under a protruding gable roof section. The south side of the main facade is recessed back slightly from the entrance section. The north side of the main facade is recessed back further to allow for a small porch. The configuration of the building is rectangular. It has an asphalt shingle gable roof.

The frame house is a one-story, one-bay by two-bay cottage on a concrete block foundation. It is covered in wood siding painted white. The main facade is asymmetrical marked by a central entrance under a protruding gable roof section. The south side of the main facade is recessed back slightly from the entrance section. The north side of the main facade is recessed back further to allow for a small porch. The configuration of the building is rectangular. It has an asphalt shingle gable roof.

The property is located on the east side of Rt. 65, .12 miles south of I-70. It is situated among a group of buildings on ¼ to ½ acre lots built from the mid-20th century up to the present time. This property appears to be from the mid-20th century.

The main facade has a central entrance with a small pediment over the doorway and concrete steps leading to the door. The gable roof vestibule is unornamented. The southernmost bay has a large eight-over-one pane window and a small three pane window in the basement. The northernmost bay has a recessed window behind the small porch that fits into the main roof. The porch railing has ornamental pattern consisting of square balusters some of which form an eight-point star. The southernmost gable end has one window on each side of an exterior-end brick chimney. This property has a modern brick garage.
