Description:

Located on the south side of E. Baltimore Street is this German-vernacular brick house, a two story, four bay structure with two central front doors. Windows have two over two pane sash; the west bay of the front elevation has an apparently added semi-hexagonal projecting bay. A Colonial Revival period front porch extends across the entire front.

According to the 1877 Atlas for Washington County, there was a building at this location that belonged to H. Dusang.


