Description:

This brick cottage is a one and half story, three bay structure, built into a slope with the ground floor fully exposed at the front elevation. This area is of stone with the main level of brick above. A bi-level shed roofed porch shelters the ground floor and provides access to the upper level. This porch is supported by large square posts and probably is a replacement of an earlier porch system. A shed-roofed, one story brick addition is attached to the east gable end. The main house has a curvilinear barge board suggesting Gothic Revival influence. Windows, within narrow frames have either single pane or six light sash.

The entrance at the upper level is in the center bay and at the lower level in the west bay. The building may have served as a residence and commercial space, as did many of the buildings along Baltimore Street.

According to the 1877 Atlas, it belonged at that time to a Mrs. Keller.
