Description:

This one story, four bay brick house is attached to its neighbor to the west and in the late 19th century at least was all part of the same property. It has a Flemish bond facade above fieldstone foundations. Windows have narrow frames and two over two pane sash which are replacements. Windows in the east gable have six over six pane sash. At the rear, the main roof span covers a framed section with a short extension. This was probably originally an open porch now enclosed with siding. The main entrance is located in the third bay from the east end of the house. This building appears to have been a residence. However, it could also have served as a store or shop originally.

The 1877 Atlas map shows it to be on the same property with the building to which it is attached on the west, under the same ownership. The owner in 1877 was Mrs. L. Grosh. Probably built about 1830, the house is linked to the busy scene in Funkstown when the National Pike was at its peak.





