Description:

This brick building is a two story, three bay structure which appears to have been initially a one story gable fronted building dating from the mid 19th century, enlarged by the addition of a second story in the Italianate style, about 1890. This supposition is supported by a visible horizontal line in the masonry between the first and second story windows. each edge of the "line" has a downward diagonal turn following an old gable line indicating that the original building was one story and gabled fronted. It is constructed entirely in common bond. First story windows have nine over nine light sash beneath wide wooden lintels typical of the mid 19th century. The second story windows have six over six lights with segmentally arched brick headers. The roof is of the shed type with a large bracketed cornice. This was originally the Dunker Church, and if constructed like other such churches in the area was a simple gable fronted one story structure, as this appears to have been.

This building is identified as the Dunker Church in the 1877 Atlas, with a cemetery shown immediately to the north.
