Description:

This stuccoed dwelling is a two and a half story, five bay duplex. Built into sloping ground, its rear or east elevation has three stories. Windows have single pane sash within openings defined by cast stone sills. Entrances are located in the third and fourth bays from the north end of the house. A shed porch extends across the three south bays, sheltering both entrances. A shed dormer extends from the roof.

It is not clear what the original function of this building was, but presumably it was a dwelling with two or more units.

Located in the northeast corner of Funkstown, it represents the later infill of areas of town away from the main street.


