DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is located on the southwest side of U. S. Route 40-A, southeast of Boonsboro and of Maryland Route 67 in Washington County. It is situated at the edge of the road and faces northeast. It is a two story, three bay brick house resting on low fieldstone foundations. A four bay ell with a partially enclosed double porch extends to the rear. A semi-hexagonal projecting bay is attached to the southeast end wall.

Windows in the front wall are quite large and may have been elongated. They have narrow frames and 20th century sashes. The main entrance is located in the east end of the front elevation. Across the entire front elevation is a Victorian period one story porch.

Bricks of the front elevation are laid in Flemish bond. Other elevations display American bond with five courses of stretchers between header rows. Brick chimneys extend from inside the end walls and from the interior of the ell.

The house appears to be in good condition.


