This is an example of an important regional rural house type. Built of brick, seven bays in length with a recessed double porch along part of the front wall, it is one of a significant number of such houses in the county, most of which date from the middle third of the 19th century. The exterior woodwork and type of masonry used on this house suggest a building date during the 1850's. This farm is one of a group in the area west of Boonsboro which is owned by the U. S. Steel Corporation. Their value to the steel company lies in the extensive limestone deposits on the land. Several farmhouses in the immediate vicinity are similar to this one.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farm is located south of Maryland Route 68, east of Millpoint and northwest of Boonsboro in Washington County. The house is situated on a slight rise of ground and faces southwest. It is a two story seven bay brick structure resting on fieldstone foundations which become several feet high at the front elevation. The four southernmost bays are recessed beneath a double porch included under the main roof span. The part of the front wall which is not recessed displays all stretcher brickwork while American bond with five courses of stretchers between header rows is used elsewhere. A frame addition is attached to the back of the house.

Openings have narrow frames topped with wide wooden lintels. All windows retain six over six pane double hung sashes. Some pairs of deteriorated louvered shutters remain. Characteristic of houses following this plan, one window in the end wall opens onto the porch.

The main entrance is located in the second bay from the west corner of the front elevation. It is framed similarly to the other openings and has a three light transom. Of the four bays recessed beneath the double porch, the two central openings at each story are doors. Those at the lower level have three light transoms. Other doors open onto the porch from the s. walls of the recess.

The porch is supported by tapered square posts and partially enclosed by a plain balustrade.

The house is roofed with standing seam sheet metal which terminates with barge boards set directly against the end walls. Brick chimneys are located inside the gables and at the interior of the house at the point where the wall is recessed for the porch.

The buildings are in deteriorated condition. Besides the house a frame barn and various outbuildings are present. The farm contains 150.01 acres.




