Jericho Farm is significant for its architecture, for its association with George Scott Kennedy, its apparent builder, who was a prominent 19th century resident of Washington County, and for its traditional association with the Civil War. According to local legend, General Meade had headquarters at the house and Abraham Lincoln's, Vice President, Hannibal Hamlin, reputedly stayed there near or during the time of the Battle of Antietam in 1862.

The Jericho Farm house is the most prominent building in the complex. A three bay, two story brick structure with a side hall, it appears to have been built between 1830 and 1850. The structure displays fine detail work of the period and appears to have received few alterations. The use of decorated corner blocks at doors and windows, colonnetts at the mantel pieces, the broad entrance and the carpenter locks are all consistent with local building practices in Washington County during the Greek Revival Period. Unusual is the molded medallion in the hall ceiling and the porch with its carved frieze.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Jericho Farm is located along a private lane extending in a southerly direction from Maryland route 68, about 3/4 mile west of Mill Point in Washington County, Maryland. The house is situated on an area of relatively level ground and faces north. It is a two story, three bay brick structure resting on low fieldstone foundations. A two story, three bay wing extends to the rear or south. The entire structure is painted white. The bricks forming the walls are laid in Flemish bond at the front elevation while American or common bond is used at the side and rear walls. Trim at the exterior includes wide wooden lintels with decorated corner blocks over the openings.

Windows which are aligned with each other in the walls, have narrow frames which hold six over six pane double hung sashes. Most windows are flanked with pairs of louvered shutters.

The main entrance is located in the east end bay of the front elevation. The entrance opening is broad, including a seven light transom over the door and side lights. The wide door has six rectangular panels and is flanked with pairs of slender colonnettes. Sheltering the entrance is a one story flat roofed porch supported by four slender doric type columns. Adorning the frieze of the porch is a delicate carved garland punctuated with bow knots.

The roof of the house is sheathed with slates and terminates with barge boards set direct against the end walls. A large brick chimney is located inside the west end wall. A second chimney which has no apparent functional purpose extends from inside the east end wall.

The interior of the front portion of the house is divided into two rooms and a broad stair and entrance hall. Prominent in the hallway is the stair which is open to the attic and a round medallion apparently of molded plaster from the center of which hangs a light fixture. Door frames in the front section of the house have symmetrically molded trim with decorated corner blocks. Six panel doors display carpenter locks. Fireplaces are trimmed with mantels having doric colonnettes. Recessed panels are present beneath parlor windows. Found in the kitchen fireplace at the rear of the house was a cast iron stove plate or fire back of Pennsylvania German design, dated 1767.

A barn and agricultural outbuildings are located south of the house. A stone dwelling southwest of the house is discussed in form WA-II-015.

The house appears to be in excellent condition and stands on a tract containing 104 acres.

In 1832, George S. Kennedy purchased 264 3/4 acres of "Jericho," "Jericho Hills," "Contentment" and "Chopper" from John Booth for \$9,262.25 (NN/663). Jericho Farm remained in the Kennedy family, descending to Elizabeth Ellen Wilson, George Scott Kennedy's daughter and her heirs, until 1952. (82/377, 137/610, 139/163, 214/21, 267/213).

According to T.J.C. Williams' History of Washington County, George Scott Kennedy was one of the wealthiest citizens of Washington County and a graduate of Princeton University. He is described as an influential man who was instrumental in the construction of the Washington County Railroad. The hospitality of George Scott Kennedy at his home, "Jericho" was noted throughout 19th century Washington County. ¹






