DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This building was for many years the tenant house for Jerico Farm located near Boonsboro. It is located south of the main farmhouse (WA-II-014) at the end of a private lane which leads in a southerly direction from Maryland Route 68, northwest of Boonsboro. The building situated on the side of a hill and facing south is a two story stone and frame structure which appears to have been altered extensively during the early 20th century.

The house now has a hipped roof with a pair of hipped roof dormers and small brick chimneys. Windows have narrow frames with two over two pane sashes. It would appear that a frame addition perhaps one third as wide as the original stone structure was added across its front.

The house looks as though it is in excellent condition.


