DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>This house is located about 1/4 mile east of Route 40A, about 1½ miles north of Boonsboro in Washington County, Maryland. It is situated on gently sloping ground and faces south.</p> <p>The structure is a one-and-a-half story, five-bay stone dwelling. A second story of frame construction was added to the stone structure in 1915. A one-and-a-half story, four-bay el of brick extends to the rear or north.</p> <p>The stone portion of the house is constructed of roughly coursed local fieldstone to which has been applied a coat of white paint. No decorative stonework is in evidence at the exterior of the structure.</p> <p>Windows appear to have been spaced evenly in the stone section. Some openings have moderately wide wooden frames while others have more modern narrow frames. Two-over-two pane sashes are present in major windows of the main section.</p> <p>The addition to the north or rear of the main section is constructed of bricks laid in common bond on high, roughly coursed fieldstone foundations. Six-panel doors are located in the two central bays. Over each door is a simple four-light transom. Windows flanking the doors contain nine-over-six light double-hung sashes.</p> <p>The roof of the main section is covered with modern shingles and extends beyond the end walls of the house. The brick section is roofed with sheet metal.</p> <p>Brick chimneys with corbeling at their tops rise from inside each gable end and from the roof ridge near its center. Other brick flues are located inside the north end of the brick section and at its center on the roof ridge.</p> <p>A one-story porch, probably dating from ca. 1915, extends across the front elevation.</p> <p>In addition to the house are a barn and other buildings related to agricultural use. The house appears to be in excellent condition. The property includes 137.5 acres.</p>

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE			
<p>The area of significance of this house is its architecture. Representing several periods of building and employing a variety of building materials, the house reflects Washington County's vernacular architecture from the early 19th century.</p> <p>The present owners have been in possession of the house since 1897, when it was conveyed to James P. Ford by Samuel E. Shifler and Frederick J. Shifler, trustees, (Liber 106, Folio 595). An 1859 map of Washington County indicates that a dwelling was present on the property then owned by W. Shifler</p>



