DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This 19th century farmstead is located at the end of a long private lane which extends in a southerly direction from Landis Road southeast of Hagerstown in Washington County, Maryland. The buildings are situated on high ground just north of I-70. The house faces north. It is a two story, five bay stuccoed stone structure with a pair of hipped-roof dormer windows set in the north slope of the roof. The date 1861 and the name Landis are written in the attic.

Windows and doors appear to be arranged symmetrically on the front elevation. Windows have narrow frames which hold six over six pane double hung sashes. The main entrance is centered in the front elevation and includes a transom with diamond shaped panes above a four panel door. A one bay entrance porch is supported by chamfered square posts with curved brackets.

The roof is covered with slates and extends beyond the end walls. Brick chimneys with corbels at their tops are located inside the end walls.

The stone wall construction beneath the stucco is said to be of rubble work suggesting that the wall surface was always covered.

A frame bank barn is located west of the house.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This stuccoed stone farm house following the five bay, central entrance plan is dated 1861. Apparently it was originally stuccoed which was a frequently used method of finishing stone houses in northern Maryland and southern Pennsylvania.

Along with the date written in the attic is the name Landis. The Landis family owned a substantial amount of property in the area with the result that both Landis Road and Landis Run were named as they were. The Landis home farm is that which is located on Landis Road opposite the entrance to this property (WA-I -435). Apparently a son was given this farm and built the house in 1861. According to the owner, an 18th century cemetery with markers inscribed with the name Rutter is located northwest of the buildings near Landis Road.

This farm is situated on part of the land grant, "Fox Deceived."


