DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This small farm is located on the south side of U.S. Route 40, west of Cool Hollow Road and southeast of Hagerstown in Washington County, Maryland. The buildings are situated on an area of level ground with the house facing northeast and the barn northwest.

The house is a two story, three bay brick structure with a one and a half story, three bay wing extending to the rear. All brick surfaces have been painted red. The front section utilizes common bonding at all elevations while at the back section all stretcher bricks are used suggesting that this portion of the structure may have a brick veneer.

Openings have narrow frames finishes with a bead at the inside edge. Wide wooden lintels are present above the openings. Six over six pane double hung sashes are used. Most windows have pairs of shutters with movable louvers and some have paneled shutters. The main entrance is located in the center bay of the front elevation and includes a multi-paned transom above the door.

A one story porch with a low roof extends across the front elevation. It is supported by square posts with straight brackets.

The roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Brick chimneys are located inside the end walls.

Behind the house are some board and batten frame outbuildings and a frame bank barn resting on stone foundations.

The buildings appear to be in excellent condition.
