DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This dirt lane no longer used is the former location of the Keedysville-Bakersville Road between Keedysville and the Antietam Creek. The road was relocated to its present alignment to the south in 1833. The original roadway remains unaltered and is bordered by fieldstone fences as are many early roads in Washington County.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This abandoned roadway is significant as a well documented 18th century road. It is believed by historians to be the road used by General Braddock on his march to Fort Duquesne in 1756. In a Washington County road plat dated 1833 when the new alignment was surveyed, the earlier route was referred to as an "old road."
