DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This log house is two stories high and three bays long and has been sheathed with composition siding. It has a two story, two bay white-washed stone addition extending to the rear. The surface treatments of the log house, the siding and the two over two pane window sashes are not original and do not reflect the true age of the house. The windows are relatively small in relation to wall area. A stone exterior chimney topped with brick above the attic level extends up the west end wall of the house.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This old log house cannot be dated without further study. However, there are several indications which point to 18th century construction. The presence of an exterior stone chimney on a log dwelling is often associated with a pre-1800 date in Washington County. The windows, relatively small in relation to wall area are also an indication of age. Additionally, the house is located along a known 18th century road where there are several complexes dating from the 1700's.


