DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This farmhouse is a two story four bay stuccoed structure said to be built of stone. The two northern bays of its front or east elevation are recessed beneath a double porch which is included under the main roof span. A one story wing, also stuccoed extends to the rear.

Unusual features of the house are exterior chimneys at the north end wall and at the end wall of the wing. Both are stuccoed to the height of one story and finished above with brick. Frame outbuildings are present as well as a large bank barn.
