The main facade has an asymmetrical first story with an off-center entrance. The main facade is marked by a full-length, one-story porch with boxed posts and stick railing. The house is positioned so that the porch is slightly raised from ground level which is unique among the other houses in Lappans. The house appears to have been constructed in the late 19th century.

The house is located on the east side of Rt. 65, .28 mile south of Lappans Road in Lappans. The property sits in a cluster of late 19th century buildings and sits on a slight rise close to the road. The main facade faces west.

The foundation is constructed of stone. The ornamentation consists of the first story porch details and plain wood trim on the windows. There are interior-end brick chimneys at the northernmost gable end of the house and at the gable end of the ell.

There are no significant outbuildings on the property.


