The frame house is a two-story, two-bay by two-bay house with one-story ell. It is constructed of frame covered in wood siding painted white. It has a gable roof covered in sheet metal. There is a molded cornice that returns at the gable ends. The floor plan is L-shaped. The structure was probably constructed in the late 19th century.

The property is located on the east side of Alt. Rt. 40, .12 mile north of Benevola Church Road in Benevola. The main facade faces west.

The main facade of the house has an entrance on the northernmost bay with a one-story, one-bay hipped roof entrance porch. The other three bays on the main facade have two-over-two pane sash windows. The windows frames have an ornamentation consisting of a molded cornice. The south gable end has an exterior-end flue constructed of brick towards the front of the house. There are also two two-over-two windows on the facade. An interior-end brick chimney rises from the south gable end. The house is constructed on a stone foundation. The one-story ell has a gable roof with an entrance on the south side.

There are several period outbuildings on the property including a small barn, smoke house, chicken coop, and several sheds.


