Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*

The parsonage is a two-and-one-half-story, three-bay-wide, detached, American Foursquare, single-family, dwelling. According to the date stone, the parsonage was dedicated on April 2, 1925. The brick house is laid in a textured, stretcher bond brick on a rubblestone foundation. The hip-roofed building has an intersecting gable located atop the projecting polygonal of the north end of the second floor. The gable has a small fanlight. The roof is clad in pressed and patterned metal. There is an interior corbel-capped chimney. The windows are 6/1 and 8/1 wood sashes. The entrance is a single-leaf door flanked with sidelights and a transom. The entrance is paired with a triple window in the south side of the facade. To the west of the parsonage is a hip-roofed garage of rusticated concrete block that appears to be a contemporary of the house. As an example of the twentieth-century popularity of the American Foursquare in Boonsboro, the parsonage is a contributing resource in the Town of Boonsboro Historic District.

BUILDING DATE: 1924-1940

The Parsonage is an east-facing, two-and-a-half-story, three-bay, brick, freestanding, residential structure. The building is set directly at the public-right-of-way and is built in a colonial revival style. A slightly raised, wide, hipped-roof porch is supported by thick brick piers connected by a railing. The hipped roof is punctured by a wide gabled dormer with a lunette window. Directly below the dormer is an oriel window. The entrance has a door flanked by sidelights and topped by a transom. Windows are double-hung.

The building was constructed sometime between 1924 and 1940, according to Sanborn maps. In all likelihood, based on the style of the building, it was erected in the 1920s. It was built on a parcel of land that had contained a frame dwelling.

The building is within the Western Maryland Geographic Organization, the Development Period of Industrial/Urban Dominance, and falls within the Historic Period Theme of Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Community Planning.




Portion of Washington Co., MD Tax Map 601 showing the location of WA-II-868 (Parcel 751), 66 South Main Street, Boonsboro, MD
