Description

This house is a two story, two bay frame Foursquare with a hipped roof, and frontal hip roofed dormer. A shed-roofed extension is attached to the south side. The windows have single pane sash and the front first story window is tripled. A porch across the front is supported by square columns. It covers both the main part of the house and the extension.

One of several American Foursquare dwellings in Keedysville, it reflects the popularity of this style in the early 20th century.
