Description

This aluminum frame house dating from the 1890s, is a two story, three bay L-shaped structure with a central entrance. It rests on stone foundations. Any original porch or entrance embellishment has been replaced by a brick stoop and aluminum hood. Windows have two over two pane sash.

This house is one of a group of structures in Taylor's Addition to Keedysville, which was developed in the 1890s. The builder's name was Kitzmiller, and the house was constructed for George Buxton.


