Description

This brick house is a two story, three bay structure with a porch extending across the entire front. Windows have single pane sash beneath wide wooden lintels, a characteristic typical of the third quarter of the 19th century. The porch detailing consists of turned posts and balusters with brackets and gingerbread. Chimneys are located inside the gable ends.

In the heart of Keedysville, this house was presumably built by D.H. Wyand and represents the main period of the town's development.


