Description

This High Victorian Gothic influenced house is a two story, three bay frame building with a central cross gable with gingerbread trim. A porch across the front of the house has been enclosed and sided with asbestos shingles to match the rest of the house. Windows have two over two pane sash, except the second story west bay which has a double window with single pane sash. Window trim on the original windows includes molded flat topped architraves typical of the turn of the century. The entrance is in the central bay. The roof is covered with corrugated sheet metal.

This house is one of several Late Victorian buildings with Gothic influence found in Keedysville. The 1877 Atlas map shows this lot as vacant.


