Description

This two story, three bay L-shaped brick house is located at the corner of Antietam Drive and South Main Street. It is a vernacular building following a type seen frequently throughout the 19th century. Windows have segmentally arched heads, a characteristic associated with the 1890-1910 period, and single pane sash. The entrance is located in the center bay. There is a hip-roofed porch across the entire front, supported by turned posts. Corbeled chimneys are located inside the end walls. There is a one-story shed roofed extension to the rear.

Now the United Methodist parsonage, this building is a conservatively designed, turn of the century period residence, typical of many in the county.
