#### Description

This commercial and residential structure is a two story, five bay frame building with a cross gable centered over the three northern bays which made up the residential portion of the house. The building is covered with German siding. The two southern bays at the first story contain a storefront consisting of large four-pane display windows flanking a recessed entrance. The main entrance is located in the center bay. The roof is covered with standing seam sheet metal and chimneys are located inside the end walls. A porch with turned posts extend across the front.

This was a millenry shop operated by Emma Thomas Snively in the early 20th century and is important for its intact exterior depicting both commercial and residential uses.

The 1877 Atlas map shows this as the property of J. Thomas. There was a slaughterhouse immediately to the south. To the north, now vacant, was broom factory which was torn down about 1970.






