DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This brick farmhouse is a two story, five bay structure with Flemish bond at the front elevation. The other walls have common bonding with four courses of stretchers between header rows. An unusual feature is a round opening in the gables lined with header bricks. Windows have wide frames with nine over six pane sashes. The inside end chimneys are tall with courses of corbeling at their tops.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Although most rural brick houses in Washington County date from the second quarter of the 19th century or later, this house has exterior characteristics which suggest that it was built during the 1800-1815 period. Among these indications are the type of door and window framing and sashes, the use of round opening in the gables, the use of common bonding with fewer than five courses of stretchers between rows and the general form and proportions of the house. Deed records for this property were traced back to 1849 when Alexander Grim gave the farm to Hanna P. B. Edwards, his daughter. The property remained in the Edwards family until 1931. 
