DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two story, four bay L-shaped brick house would appear to date from the third quarter of the 19th century. It is built in common bond at all elevations with wide wooden lintels above the window and door openings. Six over six pane sashes are used. A transom with curved muntins is present above the front door. The interior features a parlor mantel piece trimmed with Greek frets and flat pilasters. Behind the house is a one story out kitchen with a stone and brick exterior.
