DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This limestone structure is a kiln for burning lime. Built into a slope it is squarish with its top open and accessible from ground level at the back. The front has a smooth face with a rectangular opening at its bottom. Three large flat stones form the lintel over this opening. Many kilns like this one had cylindrical brick lined interiors where loose limestone rocks were put and burned. The process converted limestones into soft pure lime.

A number of lime/kilns remain in Washington County although none are in use. Most are in deteriorated condition and date from the late 19th and early 20th centuries. The lime burning industry results from the vast deposit of limestone which are present in Washington County.


