The frame house is a two-story frame structure constructed in a rectangular plan. The structure is three-bays by one-bay on a fieldstone foundation. The main facade is symmetrically arranged with a central entrance. There is a full-length porch that wraps around the west side of the house. The structure appears to date from the mid-to-late 19th century.

The property is located on the north side of Sandy Hook Road, approximately .05 mile east of Clark Road. The structure sits on a fairly level site slightly back from the road. The main facade faces south.

The two story structure is constructed of frame covered in asphalt shingles. The main facade is symmetrically arranged with a central entrance and one-over-one sash windows in the outer bays of the first and second stories. The central bays of the second story is unfenestrated. The full-length, one-story porch has a hipped roof supported by a square tapered post on brick plinths. The porch continues around the west side of the structure. The gable ends of the structure have one-over-one sash windows in the first and second stories and a small four-paned window in the gable. The house has a boxed cornice and a gable roof covered in asphalt shingles.
