The brick house is a two-story brick structure on a high stone foundation. It is constructed in an L-shape and has a two-bay brick wing on its east gable end. The main section is four-bays by one-bay. It has a gable roof with interior-end brick chimneys rising from each gable end. It is an impressive structure with its high full-story foundation on the main facade and its full-length, one-story front porch. The structure appears to date from the mid-19th century.

The property is located on the north side of Sandy Hook Road, approximately .18 mile west of Clark Road in Sandy Hook. The structure is built into a slight slope into the ground and has a full-story foundation level. The main facade faces south.

The two-story structure is constructed of brick laid in stretcher bond on a fieldstone foundation. The main facade is symmetrically arranged with two entrances in the central two bays of the structure. The outer bays of the main facade have three-over-one sash windows. Similar windows are situated in the four-bays on the second story. The two-bay wing on the east gable end has an entrance and a six-over-one sash window. The full-length porch runs the length of the main section and of the two-bay wing. It has brick plinths and square posts supporting a shed roof covered in sheet metal. The gable ends of the brick structure are unfenestrated except for two four-paned windows in each gable. Interior-end brick chimneys rise from each gable end. The roof has a molded cornice and is covered in sheet metal.

There are no significant outbuildings on the property.
